

ORDER TO REVOKE AN INTERIM PROHIBITION ORDER

HEALTH COMPLAINTS ACT 2016 Section 94

On 6 April 2021, pursuant to section 90 of the *Health Complaints Act 2016 (Act)*, the Health Complaints Commissioner (**Commissioner**) made an Interim Prohibition Order against the general health service provider named below. That Interim Prohibition Order was due to expire on 28 June 2021.

Pursuant to section 94 of the Act, the Commissioner has decided to make an Order to revoke that Interim Prohibition Order (the **Revocation Order**).

Name of the general health service provider to which the Revocation Order applies:	Elite Cosmetic Laser & Skin Clinic Pty Ltd (ACN 627 717 579) registered in BROADMEADOWS in Victoria
Date of the Revocation Order:	29 April 2021 at 12.00pm
Effect of the Revocation Order:	The Interim Prohibition Order made by the Commissioner on 6 April 2021 is revoked.
Reason for the Revocation Order:	<p>On 29 April 2021 the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (VCAT) made an order to stay the Interim Prohibition Order made by the Commissioner on 6 April 2021</p> <p>The Commissioner having considered the decision of VCAT and, based on the information available to her, considers that a serious risk to the health, safety or welfare of the public no longer exists and has decided to revoke the IPO she made on 6 April 2021. A copy of the Revocation Order will be published in the Victoria Government Gazette and on the Internet site of the Health Complaints Commissioner.</p>

In this Interim Prohibition Order 'general health service' and 'general health service provider' have the same meaning as in section 3 of the *Health Complaints Act 2016*.

This Revocation Order takes effect on the service of this Order on the general health service provider to whom it applies.
