

INTERIM PROHIBITION ORDER

HEALTH COMPLAINTS ACT 2016 Section 90

This Interim Prohibition Order is made pursuant to section 90 of the *Health Complaints Act* 2016.

The Health Complaints Commissioner (**Commissioner**) has made this Interim Prohibition Order because the Commissioner reasonably believes that the general health service provider named below has contravened a code of conduct applying to the general health service being provided and is satisfied that it is necessary to make this order to avoid a serious risk to the health, safety or welfare of the public.

Date on which this Interim Prohibition Order can remain in force for up to 12 weeks. This Interim Prohibition Order will remain in force until 25 January 2021 while an investigation is conducted unless it is revoked before that date. Effect of this Interim Prohibition Order: 1. The general health service provider named above must not, directly or indirectly: • advertise or cause to be advertised, or • offer or cause to be provided, or • provide or cause to be provided, or • establish, direct or otherwise operate any business that either advertises, offers or provides (or causes to be advertised, offered or provided) any general health service (paid or otherwise, in a clinical or non-clinical capacity) that involves massage therapy services to any female member of the public. 2. The general health service provider named above must display a copy of this Interim Prohibition Order at their business premises and ensure that it is easily visible to the public. 3. The general health service provider named above must publish a copy of this Interim Prohibition Order on any website he uses to offer or promote any general health service that involves, or is in any way related to, massage therapy. 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Exception Paragraph 1 does not apply where the general health service provider named above is undertaking supervised professional placements at the Peter James Centre in East Burwood as part of a Bachelor of Physiotherapy degree program.

In this Interim Prohibition Order 'general health service' and 'general health service provider' have the same meaning as in section 3 of the Health Complaints Act 2016.

This Interim Prohibition Order takes effect on the service of the order on the general health service provider to whom it applies.
