

INTERIM PROHIBITION ORDER

HEALTH COMPLAINTS ACT 2016 Section 90

This order is made pursuant to section 90 of the *Health Complaints Act 2016*.

The Health Complaints Commissioner (the Commissioner) has made this Interim Prohibition Order because the Commissioner reasonably believes that the general health service provider named below has contravened a code of conduct applying to the general health service being provided and is satisfied that it is necessary to make this order to avoid a serious risk to the health, safety or welfare of the public.

Name of the general health service provider on whom the Interim Prohibition Order is imposed:	Melbourne TT Pty Ltd (Melbourne TT) (ACN 626 899 984), 1110E/888 Collins Street, Docklands, Melbourne VIC 3008.
Date this Interim Prohibition Order is made:	18 December 2018
Date on which this Interim Prohibition Order expires:	An Interim Prohibition Order can remain in force for up to 12 weeks. This Interim Prohibition Order will remain in force until 12 March 2019 while an investigation is conducted unless it is varied or revoked before that date.
Effect of this Interim Prohibition Order:	<p>Melbourne TT must not cause, direct or otherwise facilitate the following actions by any person unless that person is a person registered under the <i>Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (Victoria) Act 2009</i> or otherwise authorised by law to perform that action:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Provide or cause to be provided, paid or otherwise, in a clinical or non-clinical capacity to any person, any cosmetic surgical and medical procedures, including any cosmetic surgical procedure that involves cutting the skin and any cosmetic medical procedure that involves piercing the skin, including injectable cosmetic treatments. 2. Be in possession of or store any Schedule 4 drugs for cosmetic use including Botulinum toxin (Botox) and hyaluronic acid injection preparations (dermal fillers). 3. Administer or cause to be administered to any person any Schedule 4 drugs for cosmetic use

	including Botulinum toxin (Botox) and hyaluronic acid injection preparations (dermal fillers). 4. Administer or cause to be administered to any person any unregistered therapeutic good or scheduled medicine.
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This Interim Prohibition Order takes effect on the service of the order on the general health service provider to whom it applies.
