

## INTERIM PROHIBITION ORDER

## HEALTH COMPLAINTS ACT 2016 Section 90

This Interim Prohibition Order is made pursuant to section 90 of the *Health Complaints Act 2016*.

The Health Complaints Commissioner (**Commissioner**) has made this Interim Prohibition Order because the Commissioner reasonably believes that the general health service provider named below has contravened a code of conduct applying to the general health service being provided and is satisfied that it is necessary to make this order to avoid a serious risk to the health, safety or welfare of the public.

- at their business premises and ensure that it is easily visible to the public until such time as the Interim Prohibition Order is expired or revoked.
- 4. The general health service provider named above must publish a copy of this Interim Prohibition Order, that is easily visible to the public, on the homepage of any website or social media platform they use to offer or promote any general health services including (but not limited to) the following websites:

  - ii. <a href="https://smile.org.au/">https://smile.org.au/</a>
  - iii. <a href="http://biolyfe.org/">http://biolyfe.org/</a>
- 5. The published IPO must remain on all websites and social media platforms at all times until the IPO has expired or is revoked.

In this Interim Prohibition Order 'general health service' and 'general health service provider' have the same meaning as in section 3 of the *Health Complaints Act 2016*.

This Interim Prohibition Order takes effect on the service of the order on the general health service provider to whom it applies.
