

## ORDER TO REVOKE AN INTERIM PROHIBITION ORDER

### **HEALTH COMPLAINTS ACT 2016 Section 94**

On 18 May 2020, pursuant to section 90 of the *Health Complaints Act 2016 (Act)*, the Health Complaints Commissioner (**Commissioner**) made an Interim Prohibition Order against the general health service provider named below. That Interim Prohibition Order was due to expire on 9 August 2020.

Pursuant to section 94 of the Act, the Commissioner has decided to make an Order to revoke that Interim Prohibition Order (the **Revocation Order**).

<b>Name of the general health service provider to which the Revocation Order applies:</b>	Mozhgan Elikaie of SOUTH MORANG in the State of Victoria
<b>Date of the Revocation Order:</b>	3 July 2020
<b>Effect of the Revocation Order:</b>	The Interim Prohibition Order made by the Commissioner on 18 May 2020 is revoked.
<b>Reason for the Revocation Order:</b>	<i>I have considered new evidence and consequently find that the serious risk referred to in the Interim Prohibition Order made against Mozhgan Elikaie on 18 May 2020 no longer exists. Accordingly, I revoke the Interim Prohibition Order.</i>

In this Interim Prohibition Order 'general health service' and 'general health service provider' have the same meaning as in section 3 of the *Health Complaints Act 2016*.

This Revocation Order takes effect on the service of this Order on the general health service provider to whom it applies.

In accordance with section 94 of the Act, this Revocation Order will be published in the Victoria Government Gazette and on the Internet site of the Health Complaints Commissioner, [www.hcc.vic.gov.au](http://www.hcc.vic.gov.au).
